**FIRE DEPT.  
REPORT**

Chief Gilgenberg reported that 1 FF/PM would be off for 5 to 6 months for a non-work related injury. Members of the Fire Department have been out clearing snow around as many fire hydrants as possible and a list has been obtained from the Senior Center so the Department can check on the well being of seniors during this cold spell / pandemic period. Chief Gilgenberg also reported that applications for grants have been submitted for a new fire engine @ \$450,000.00 and 3 CPR devices @ \$20,000.00 each.

**BUILDING &  
ZONING

Commissioner Ricchiuto reported that a new group is looking at the former Burlington Coat Factory property and Burger King would be re-opening with a modern building at its location on 79<sup>th</sup> Street east of Harlem.

**PUBLIC WORKS  
REPORT**

Director Burris reported that the City is keeping up with snow removal on the city streets which, for the size of Burbank, is 69.4 miles of roadway. Republic Services is ramping up on garbage removal, as they were behind because of the weather. Mayor Foy informed the audience that a robo-call was suppose to take place during the storm to all residents from Republic, but that never occurred, which led to delays and disgruntled customers.
