

REGULAR MEETING OF THE BURBANK CITY COUNCIL APRIL 13, 2022

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of April 13, 2022 was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Dan M. Foy in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79th Street Burbank, II.

ROLL CALL

Mayor Foy requested a roll call which indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Barb Gagle, Alderman Robert Contreras, Alderwoman Sheri Gustafson, Alderman Claude Haerr, Alderman John Pacella, Alderman Mitchell Piznarski, Alderman Thomas Phillips, Mayor Dan M. Foy, Clerk Barry J. Szymczak and Treasurer Dave Viverito. Also in attendance: City Attorney Vince Cainkar.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE Mayor Foy asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

JOURNAL

Mayor Foy asked for a motion to approve the minutes of March 23, 2022. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella with unanimous approval by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

CURRENT BILLS Mayor Foy then asked for a motion to approve the current list of bills. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderwoman Gagle. CLERK'S REPORT Clerk Szymczak reported that a bid opening took place on Friday March 25th in Council Chambers in reference to the 2022 Street Rehabilitation Bond Fund Program. The following companies submitted bids:

BUILDING AND ZONING Commissioner Ricchiuto reported 46 new permits, 2 new home construction projects and 20 contractor's licenses to date for the month of April. He also stated that Goodwill will be taking possession of the former Home Goods property.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT Director Burris reported the acquisition of 60 new "\$250.00 fine warning signs" which will be installed throughout the City.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT City Engineer Geary reported the 2022 paving project would begin the week of April 18th on Meade between 85th & 87th Streets.

ADMINIS-TRATION Mayor Foy had no report to file for this meeting.

OLD BUSINESS There was no old business to discuss for this meeting.

NEW BUSINESS Alderwoman Gustafson made a motion seconded by Alderman Piznarski to award Lindahl Brothers, Inc. as low bidder for the 2022 Street Rehabilitation Bond Funds Project in the amount of \$1,507,827.89. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and o Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.

Alderwoman Gagle made a motion seconded by Alderman Haerr to hire the following candidates to the Burbank Police Department subject to successful completion and graduation from the Illinois State Police Training Academy.

A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips. The candidates were sworn in by Fire-Police Commission Secretary Chris Wiest.

CITIZEN'S REPORT The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky 8548 S. Lavergne who inquired about the new physical fitness center opening up on 79th St. Mayor Foy indicated that it would be used for specialized fitness training and would not be in competition with the Fusion. Mr. Bandusky also inquired about the progress of the new hotel on State Rd. and Central and the restaurant east of the Woodspring Suites Hotel. Mayor Foy said progress is being made at both locations, although a little behind their respective schedules.

ADMINIS-TRATION Mayor Foy informed any Reavis High School students that they could have their government class forms signed by any City Official at the adjournment of the Council Meeting. He also, on behalf of himself and City Council, wished everyone in attendance, along with all the residents of Burbank, a joyous Easter holiday.
