

REGULAR MEETING OF THE BURBANK CITY COUNCIL JUNE 15, 2022

CALL TO ORDER	The meeting of June 15, 2022 was called to order by Mayor Dan M. Foy at 7:30 PM in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79 th Street Burbank, II.
ROLL CALL	A roll call indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Barb Gagle, Alderman Robert Contreras, Alderwoman Sheri Gustafson, Alderman Claude Haerr, Alderman John Pacella, Alderman Mitchell Piznarski, Alderman Thomas Phillips, Mayor Dan M. Foy, Clerk Barry J. Szymczak and Treasurer Dave Viverito. Also in attendance: City Attorney Vince Cainkar.
PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE	Mayor Foy asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.
JOURNAL	Mayor Foy asked for a motion to approve the minutes of May 25, 2022. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella with unanimous approval by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
CURRENT BILLS	Mayor Foy then asked for a motion to approve the current list of bills. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderwoman Gagle. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.
CLERK'S REPORT	Clerk Szymczak reported that a bid opening was held on Wednesday June 8, 2022 at City Hall in reference to the purchase of a new 2023 Rosenbauer Fire Dept. Rescue Pumper. The following company submitted a bid:

ORDINANCES / RESOLUTIONS / PETITIONS	Alderman Piznarski made a motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to adopt Ordinance # 12-6-22 requesting a variation to install a 6' privacy fence on front yard side set back for the property located at 8447 Merrimac Burbank, II. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.
	Alderman Haerr made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to adopt Ordinance # 13-6-22 requesting a variation to install a 6' privacy fence on front yard side set back for the property located at 8246 Latrobe Burbank, Il. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.

Alderwoman Gagle made a motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to ask the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance for Department of Zoning, Planning and Development Petition #22-05-1 Joseph Pisciotti 5512 W. 79 th St. Burbank, II. requesting a special use for a mechanical repair shop which was approved by Zoning. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.
	Alderman Phillips made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to ask the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance for Department of Zoning, Planning and Development Petition #22-05-02 Rosanna Mendez 8255 Newland Burbank, II. requesting a variation to install a 6' privacy fence on front yard side set back which was approved by Zoning per conditions. Alderman Phillips stated that the fence would be constructed in step heights, 4' to 5' to 6' to eliminate any view blockage. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.
	Alderman Haerr made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gustafson to authorize the purchase of a 2023 Rosenbauer Commando BXT Resscue Pumper for the Burbank Fire Department for a price not to exceed \$844,528.00. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips.
COMMITTEE REPORTS	Alderwoman Gagle made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gustafson to promote FF/PM Anthony Marciano to the rank of Engineer to the Burbank Fire Department. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Haerr, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Phillips. The candidate was sworn in by Fire-Police Commission Secretary Chris Wiest. Engineer Marciano's father presented him with his shield. Mayor Foy read a brief biography.
POLICE DEPT. REPORT	Chief Garcia reported that the 2 academy candidates have graduated and are currently in the F.T.O. Program as of June13th. He also reported the initiated of the Lexipol Procedure Policy Program. All officers are receiving revised policy procedures in small increments.
FIRE DEPT. REPORT	Chief Gilgenberg thank the City for the purchase approval of the new fire pumper. This is the largest purchase of equipment in the City's history. The Chief also recognized the following fire personnel for their input on the design of the pumper: Bat. Chief Kreil, Fire Engineer Pesha, FF/PM Hyzynski and FF/PM Blaudin.
BUILDING AND ZONING	Commissioner Ricchiuto reported 1 new home construction starting and GFS will be undergoing major remodeling.
PUBLIC WORKS REPORT	Director Burris reported that the MWRD will be conducting weekly mosquito abatement in the area of the Melvina Ditch project.
CITY ENGINEER REPORT	City Engineer Geary reported the paving project has reached 70% completion. There is a delay due to a strike by Local 150 workers. He also reported that MWRD has signed off on the City Hall parking lot project and it will be going out for bid by the end of the summer.
ADMINIS- TRATION	Mayor Foy reported that there is some interest from an investor in the Georgious property. He also reported that he attended a meeting with Chief Garcia, Dep. Chief Casey and representatives from Safespeed Corp. They will be donating 5 new license plate readers to the City for more aggressive traffic situations.
CITIZEN'S REPORT	The Chair recognized Frank Pryztula 129 Pinehurst Court who thanked the City on behalf of the Stickney Council on Aging for its cooperation in donations for the Manteno Veterans Home. He also introduced a few members of the committee who participated in receiving and distribution of donations.

There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella with unanimous approval and so declared by the Chair. The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 PM.
