

## REGULAR MEETING OF THE BURBANK CITY COUNCIL OCTOBER 12, 2022

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of October 12, 2022 was called to order by Mayor Dan M. Foy at 7:30 PM in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79<sup>th</sup> Street Burbank, II.

**ROLL CALL** 

A roll call indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Barb Gagle, Alderman Robert Contreras, Alderwoman Sheri Gustafson, Alderman Claude Haerr, Alderman John Pacella, Alderman Mitchell Piznarski, Alderman Thomas Phillips, Mayor Dan M. Foy, Clerk Barry J. Szymczak and Treasurer Dave Viverito. Also in attendance: City Attorney Vince Cainkar.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE Mayor Foy asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

**JOURNAL** 

Mayor Foy asked for a motion to approve the minutes of September 28, 2022. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella with unanimous approval by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

CURRENT BILLS Mayor Foy then asked for a motion to approve the current list of bills. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderwoman Gagle. TREASURER'S REPORT

ORDINANCES / PETITIONS / RESOLUTIONS

Alderman Haerr made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gustafson to adopt Ordinance #22-10-22 authorizing a special use to allow the use and operation of a cannabis dispensing organization on the property located at 7844 S. Cicero Ave. Burbank, Il. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. POLICE DEPT. REPORT Chief Garcia had no report to file for this meeting.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING (CONT'D.)

FIRE DEPT. REPORT Chief Gilgenberg reported he had attended a 9-1-1 meeting at Oak Lawn Central Dispatch, of which he is co-chairman. The City receives a percentage of telephone and cell phone fees to help defer the cost of dispatching. A check was issued to the City in the amount of \$372,000.00 for monies not spent in the past year.

BUILDING AND ZONING Comm. Joe Hession had no report to file for this meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT Director Jim Burris reported that the recent Recycling Day was a tremendous success.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT No report was filed for this meeting.

ADMINIS-TRATION Mayor Foy reported that concrete work on existing streets should be completed this week and concrete cutting on additional streets will begin next week. The Mayor deferred to Clerk Szymczak for a report on the City's website. The Clerk said that the company that handles server issues for the site, which is based in Florida, was hacked recently, along with hundreds of other accounts which the company services when they ultimately refused to pay millions of dollars to deter the situation. According to the City's I.T. Department, all of the City's information was on back-up. The I.T. Department is in the process of creating a new website, more user friendly. Basic information is already loaded for use.

CITIZEN'S REPORT The Chair recognized a concerned citizen from 7941 S. Natoma who was inquiring about the delay in property tax bills. Mayor Foy and Attorney Cainkar both stated that the 2<sup>nd</sup> installment bills from 2021 would be out the first of December and the 1<sup>st</sup> installment of the 2022 bill would be sent out in February. Mayor Foy stated that citizens should try to make the 2<sup>nd</sup> installment payment before the end of the year so as to claim it in their taxes.

ADMINIS-TRATION Mayor Foy asked that any Reavis High School students in attendance who needed their government class forms validated, could do so at the adjournment of the Council meeting.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderwoman Gustafson and seconded by Alderman Contreras with unanimous approval and so declared by the Chair. The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 PM.
