

## REGULAR MEETING OF THE BURBANK CITY COUNCIL MAY 24, 2023

**CALL TO ORDER** 

The meeting of May 24, 2023 was called to order by Mayor Dan M. Foy at 7:30 PM in the Council

Chambers at 6530 West 79th Street Burbank, II.

ROLL CALL

A roll call indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Barb Gagle (via Zoom), Alderman Robert Contreras, Alderwoman Sheri Gustafson, Alderman Claude Haerr, Alderman John Pacella. ADMINIS-TRATION REPORT Mayor Foy reported that the Girl Scouts Distribution Center will be having a grand opening on June 10<sup>th</sup> at 79<sup>th</sup> & Lamon. He also stated that the City is looking to sell a residential lot to a perspective buyer pending appraisal.

CLERK'S REPORT Clerk Szymczak reported that City Council will be on summer schedule June through August with Committee meetings on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday and Council meetings on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday.

Chief Gilgenberg reported that F.D. personnel recently conducted training with Park District and Life Guards in "Stop the Bleed" techniques. He also reported the Department would be conducting a mock "disaster drill" at Harr Park on Wednesday May 31st from 8 to 1 P.M.

## BUILDING AND ZONING

Comm. Hession reported 43 contractor licenses and 171 building permits issued during the month of May, along with 2 new construction permits and a second story addition.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT Dir. Burris reported Memorial Day flags installed that the Department is looking into the possible purchase of "Jersey Barriers" for the City.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT City Engineer Geary reported Phase I Street Rehab. was pushed back to a June 1st starting date. He also reported the roofing project is going along smoothly and grants are being looked into for the 79th Street Lighting Project.

OLD BUSINESS

Alderman Haerr made a motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to approve the hiring of lateral candidate Alyssa Makhamre as patrol officer for the Burbank Police Department pending final certification documentation. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Ald. Gagle, Ald. Contreras, Ald, Gustafson, Ald. Haerr, Ald. Pacella, Ald. Piznarski and Ald. Phillips. The candidate was sworn in by Fire-Police Commission Chris Wiest.

CITIZEN'S REPORT A concerned citizen residing at 8115 Natoma inquired about the daily fireworks disturbances in and around that are. Mayor Foy asked Deputy Chief Casey to give that area special attention.
