The meeting of October 25, 2023 was called to order by Mayor Dan M. Foy at 7:30 PM in the

Mayor Foy asked for a motion to approve the minutes of October 11, 2023. The motion was made by Ald. Contreras and seconded by Ald. Pacella with unanimous approval by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

COMMITTEE No reports were filed for this meeting. REPORTS POLICE DEPT. Chief Garcia had no report to file for this meeting. REPORT FIRE DEPT. Chief Gilgenberg had no report to file for this meeting. REPORT BUILDING Comm. Hession reported 25 contractor licenses and 103 permits issued this month. AND **ZONING** Dir. Burris reported new signs being installed throughout the City and accessories being prepared **PUBLIC** WORKS for additional camera installations. REPORT Mayor Foy reported sod installation on 82nd Street and rooftop units scheduled for installation CITY during the 2nd week of November. **ENGINEER** REPORT There was no old business brought before City Council. OLD **BUSINESS** NEW The Burbank Fire and Police Departments, in response to a nomination from Fire Dept. Lt. BUSINESS Anthony Pesha, EMS Coordinator to the Commendation Board, presented Life Saving Commendation awards to Engineer Randy Harding and Police Officer Josh Smith for an incident which occurred on August 1, 2023. Through their diligent efforts in medical assistance, the patient who was in full cardiac arrest, was brought back to consciousness and transported to Advocate Christ Medical Center, was eventually released and would have a full recovery. Chief Gilgenberg, along with Chief Garcia, presented the awards. The City of Burbank proudly salutes both individuals. The Chair recognized a concerned citizen at 4831 W. 85th Street who had concerns about a CITIZEN'S REPORT residence on the block being used as an assisted living location and possible mistreatment of patients who are dropped off there. Mayor Foy instructed Chief Gilgenberg to investigate and notify the Stickney Township Health Department for further information on this matter as it falls under their jurisdiction. The Chair then recognized a concerned citizen from 8605 S. Normandy who had concerns about maintenance at the Melvina Reservoir, particularly lawn cutting on the west side of the property. Mayor Foy explained that the MWRD is still responsible for maintenance of the property until all specifications have been met by them. The City is in constant contact with MWRD on remaining issues and hopes to have everything resolved as soon as possible. **ADMINIS-**The Mayor requested that any Reavis High School students in attendance who need their **TRATION** government class forms validated could do so at the adjournment of the Council meeting. There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Ald. Gustafson and seconded by Ald. Contreras with unanimous approval and so declared by the Chair. The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 PM.
