



VEHICLE STICKERS

An appreciative "THANK YOU" to the residents of Burbank for help making the inaugural online and mail-in City Sticker Sales Program in 2022 a reality and quite successful. As in any new venture, there were definitely a few glitches which are actively being addressed to assure a better flow in sales next year.

A major issue I found was not in the system itself, but the amount of last day sales. The Clerk's Office handled over 1200 over-the-counter sales on the final day which is unheard of. We allow in the area of 9 weeks to make your purchase. I have pushed very hard to initiate this new system for the sole purpose of convenience to all our residents. I sincerely hope that the online and mail-in response for next year will greatly improve.

Applications for the 2023 Vehicle Sticker campaign will be mailed out the week of March 27th, 2023. First day of regular sales will begin on Monday April 3rd, 2023, consisting of online, mail-in and over the counter. There will be no Saturday business hours. City Hall will also be closed on Friday April 7th in observance of Good Friday and Monday May 29th for Memorial Day. Final day of regular sales will be Wednesday May 31st at 6:30 P.M. Doors will close promptly at that time. *Unfortunately, anyone in* line after that time will be unable to make their purchase.

After reviewing your application, please make any necessary corrections or additions at home prior to making your purchase. Vital information needed to process is as follows: Name, Address, Apartment number (if applicable), City, State, Zip Code, Phone Number, Email Address (if available), Drivers License number, License Plate number, State, Year of Vehicle, Make, Model and Color. Online purchases using your credit card (2.3% service charge) can be made at www.burbankil.gov by clicking on the hyperlink and following the directions on the V-Pay site. Purchases are also available by mail (check or money order only) and over-the-counter (cash/check/credit card) at City Hall.

Remember, new residents have 30 days to purchase a vehicle sticker from the time of property closing and/or 30 days from the time of vehicle purchase, with documented proof in both instances. Senior citizens reaching the age of 65 before June 1, 2023 shall pay a reduced sticker fee of \$15.00 for one (1) passenger vehicle per household or vehicles with handicap registration license plates (hanging placard does not apply) shall pay a reduced fee of \$15.00 for one (1) passenger vehicle per household. If you wish to transfer a sticker from one vehicle to another, you have 30 days. You must bring in the old sticker. If the sticker can be re-used, there is no charge. If the sticker is destroyed in any way, a \$5.00 fee will be applied.

YARD WASTE

Stickers are available at the Clerk's Office. Yard waste begins April 1, 2022 and ends November 30, 2022.

ANIMAL REGISTRATION

Please make sure you register your pets. Animal licenses are available at a cost of \$5.00 for each pet.

"NO SOLICITORS INVITED"

Stickers are available at the Clerk's Office. Valid solicitors are instructed to honor all "NO SOLICITORS INVITED" stickers properly displayed at the residence. In the past, we have had issues with various solicitors in reference to their sales tactics. The City will THOROUGHLY **INVESTIGATE** any complaints from citizens regarding questionable sales tactics and will suspend or revoke the solicitors permit if necessary.



DO NOT HESITATE to CALL 9-1-1 or THE CLERK'S OFFICE WITH COMPLAINTS.

BUSINESS REGULATORY CERTIFICATES

All businesses in Burbank must obtain a business regulatory license. This certificate may be obtained only after passing inspections by our Building and Fire Departments, as well as meeting the necessary requirements of the Stickney Township Environmental Health Department. Please contact the Clerk's Office for further information at 708-599-5500. Certificate applications are available at City Hall or on the City's website (www.burbankil.gov) on the Home Page under "Quick Links" or on the Clerk's page under "Forms". Business certificates are renewable annually and expire on December 31st. Renewal forms are mailed out mid-October as to give all business owners ample time to fill out the necessary information. There is a monthly penalty payment of \$100.00 after January 1st until the fee is paid. All vending, amusement and video gaming machines must be noted on the forms and the appropriate stickers applied.

REAL ESTATE SALES

Please note that the City of Burbank now requires proof of full payment of water and refuse bills prior to the issuance of a real estate transfer tax stamp. (Ord. #29-11-17 passed on 11/22/2017).

SNOW PLOWING PROCEDURES

Snow routes are plowed first, curb to curb. Check to see where your closest snow route is. No one should have to travel more than two blocks to get to a snow route.

After the snow routes are opened, the secondary or lesser used streets are plowed. These streets are not always plowed back to the curbs during a large snow fall until after the snow has stopped, as the plows will continue to return to the snow routes to keep them open.

The secondary streets in areas that do not have off-street parking may take as long as three days to be plowed, curb to curb, because of the number of cars parked on the street.

During the winter months, we receive complaints that our plows push the snow from the streets onto driveways. Unfortunately, there is nothing else we can do with the snow.

The City of Burbank does not plow alleys as our main emphasis is to keep our streets open.

The Department of Public Works would like to remind residents of the following city ordinance:

Section 4-54 of the City Code states: "Snow removal from sidewalks and driveways is the owner's responsibility. No person shall cause or permit the shoveling, plowing, dumping, throwing, pushing or depositing of snow or ice from his property onto the street pavement."

"Sidewalks must be kept clear of snow; this includes businesses also. It shall be unlawful to shovel, dump, push or deposit snow or ice from PRIVATE PROPRTY onto the STREET PAVEMENT, or SIDEWALK AREA. If you have a snow plowing service, please inform them of the ordinance, or give them a copy of this section."

Remember... Slow down when streets are snow-covered!

MELVINA DITCH RESERVOIR - CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction on the Melvina Ditch Reservoir is nearing completion. The newly excavated volume has more than doubled the storage capacity of the reservoir to accommodate over 117 million gallons of stormwater. The pump

rehabilitation will be completed this winter, and in 2023 the City of Burbank and the MWRD will work together to establish vegetation at the bottom of the pond. The expansion of the reservoir provides benefits for approximately 430 residential properties through reduced risk of flooding during storms.

REFUSE SERVICE: SINGLE-FAMILY AND TWO-FAMILY STRUCTURES (Section 7-644)

All residents of the City of Burbank are required, by law, to have their trash, recyclables and landscape waste removed, from their residence, *without exception*. Refuse service is not included in your monthly water bill. Republic Services is the company that services the City of Burbank. If you are a new resident or if you are an existing resident and not paying for refuse collection, please contact Republic Services at (708) 385-8252 to establish an account for refuse pickup. Failure to comply with this law will result in a fine of a *minimum* of \$150.00.

IS YOUR 96-GALLON GARBAGE or RECYCLING CART DAMAGED?

Public Works can replace: lids, wheels and axles

Replacement carts can be purchased at the following locations:

Public Works – acceptable forms of payment include check/money order

City Hall – acceptable forms of payment include cash, credit card, check/money order

Please note: a \$62.50 replacement fee is charged for carts that are lost, stolen or damaged beyond repair.



The Blight Department would like to remind residents and property owners of the following:

- No trash/debris or abandoned vehicles are to be parked or stored on the property.
- No storage, of any kind, is permitted on empty lots.



I regularly talk about CPR in my newsletter articles. Now more than ever, it is important for everyone to be prepared to help a family member, friend, or perfect stranger should they need quick assistance.

Long time Burbank resident Bob Kamuda suffered a heart attack while exercising at the Burbank Fusion Recplex and went into cardiac arrest. Luckily for Bob, Tiffany Remezas, a fellow gym member, immediately started CPR and applied an AED (automatic external defibrillator). Burbank Fire Department paramedics quickly arrived and were able to restore a pulse and respirations. Bob has made a full recovery and can be seen in the picture to the right with Tiffany Remezas, just a few months after his emergency. Welcome back Bob!!!

I would like to commend Tiffany for being prepared and saving the life of another as well as the Burbank Park District for having the lifesaving AED readily available where it is needed.

A MESSAGE OF SAFETY

This year, the week of October 9-15 we celebrate 100 years of fire prevention! There have been many changes and advances in the history of the fire service but as always, our primary goal is life safety and this year is no different. The theme of this year's Fire Prevention week is "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape." This means that the time to make a plan is not when the emergency is happening but well beforehand. We hope to educate you and your family in ways to be prepared for emergencies in the home.

- Today's home fires burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes or less to safely escape from the time the smoke alarm sounds.
- Make the first Saturday of each month "Smoke Alarm Saturday."
 Test all smoke alarms to ensure they work for when you need them.
- If your smoke alarm makes a "chirp" that means it is time to replace the battery.
- Develop a home fire escape plan and practice it at least twice a year.
- Draw a map of your home, and mark two ways out. Make sure escape routes are clear and doors and windows can be easily opened.
- Pick a permanent outside meeting place, like a neighbor's home, a mailbox, a street light, etc. that is a safe distance from your home where everyone can meet.
- If your fire alarm monitoring system in your home, multi-family residence, or business alerts, do not silence or reset it. Doing so may delay a timely response from the fire department to the effected unit and in tracking down problems in the alarm system.




