**CALL TO  
ORDER**

The meeting of October 28, 2015 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79<sup>TH</sup> Street in Burbank, Illinois

Alderman Szymczak said under the 2016 MFT Maintenance Material –Bulk Rock Salt (2,000 tons) – he said he would like to make a motion seconded by Alderman Looney to award Morton Salt as the lowest bidder of \$58.01 per ton. He said last year we paid \$138 per ton so this is a considerable savings for the city. A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Pacella, Looney, Grider, Foy and Szymczak.
