



REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE  
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL  
SEPTEMBER 9, 2015

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of September 9, 2015 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> street in Burbank, Illinois.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach and Attorney Vince Cainkar. Absent: Alderman Szymczak.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of August 19, 2015 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Foy to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Piznarski, Foy, Grider, Looney and Pacella.
- DEPT. OF ADMINISTRATION** Mayor Klein asked the indulgence of the City Council and the audience to bow their heads in a silent tribute to Colleen Pollard who passed away recently. She was an Alderwoman of the 2<sup>nd</sup> ward and those of us who knew her liked her. She was a good ambassador for the city and was buried last Friday. He then said have mercy on her soul.
- DEPT. OF FINANCE** Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to approve **Ordinance No. 32-9-15 levying taxes for general and corporate purposes for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2015 for the City of Burbank.** A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Pacella, Looney, Pyle, Grider and Foy.
- NEW BUSINESS** Alderman Looney thanked the Mayor, the City Administration, our Fire Chief, Police Chief and all the city agencies and people in Burbank in general for the outpouring for his wife's wake. He said there was a very large turnout and her family of eight all grew up here and were truly thankful. He said he would miss Colleen terribly and was happy that she did not suffer and if he missed thanking anyone he is truly sorry. Mayor Klein extended his condolences on behalf of the City to Mike and his family.
- CITIZEN'S REPORT** Mayor Klein then recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 S. Lavergne who said he drives around and is concerned with what he sees and he was concerned with his neighbors and was wondering if they were on Section 8. The Mayor told him that we do not know where the Section 8 houses are and we do not keep a list. He said that there is cars with no stickers on them and he says he knows when they move in they get 90 days to buy a sticker. Clerk Roach told him that they have 30 days from the time they move in to buy a sticker and then they are double

in price after that. Mayor Klein instructed Chief Shore to write the address down and have someone check it out. He then wanted to know the status of the house at 5001 W. 85<sup>th</sup> street as it has been empty for four years. Frank Kainrath said it is in foreclosure. The next house he inquired about was 4941 W. 84<sup>th</sup> street and Frank told him that house was for sale and Mr. Bandusky said there was no sign and Frank told him it was on the internet for sale. The next house was 8442 S. Lavergne and he addressed Alderman Foy about why there were so many cars and some parked against a fence in his back yard. Alderman Foy said what is wrong with having cars there. Frank Kainrath said the police have ticketed them several times and the owner does live there. His last house that he was interested in was 8349 S. Lavergne where there was a dirty mattress in the window and he asked if Frank or Dan Foy had seen it. They both said they had drove by but were not looking for a mattress. He asked if that house was empty and Frank said he was not sure. Mayor Klein asked him if he wanted it checked out and he said he would appreciate that.

He then asked the Mayor if he felt Burbank was going up or down and the Mayor replied from your perspective it was the latter. He then wanted to know if the City gave a license to that Mexican restaurant that is supposed to move in where Bakers Square is. Mayor Klein said we certainly did and Mr. Bandusky wanted to know why they have not opened yet. Mayor Klein said they were remodeling and they could open it up whenever they wanted to. He then wanted to know where Dunkin doughnuts is going and the Mayor said they were supposed to go into the old Clark gas station and right now we have a demolition order on it as we speak. He then wanted to know about the status of Cezar's Inn and Mayor Klein said they were trying to get some viable businesses in there. Mayor Klein asked him if there was anything else and he said no and Mayor Klein said that was plenty.
