



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
MAY 26, 2016

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of May 26, 2016 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79th street in Burbank, Illinois.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski, Foy, Looney, and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Deputy Clerk Chisholm and Attorney Vince Cainkar. Absent: Clerk Roach.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Pacella to approve the minutes of May 11, 2016 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pacella, Piznarski, Szymczak, Pyle, Foy, Looney, and Szymczak.
- CITY CLERK** Deputy Clerk Chisholm reported that the City of Burbank will be closed on Monday May 30, 2016 in observance of Memorial Day and Tuesday May 31, 2016 is the last day to purchase the City Stickers without penalty.
- PUBLIC HEARING BONDS** Mayor Klein turned the public meeting over to attorney Vince Cainkar to conduct the public hearing. The proposed issuance by the City of Burbank, Cook County Illinois of its not to exceed \$6,000,000 in the aggregate principal amount of its Revenue Refunding Bonds (Science and Arts Academy Project), Series 2016. There were no questions so Mr. Cainkar said the Mayor could conclude the public hearing. Mayor Klein said the hearing was held pursuant to law.
- DEPT. OF FINANCE** Motion made by Alderman Grider, seconded by Szymczak to approve **ORDINANCE 11-5-16** providing for the issuance by the City of Burbank, Illinois of its not to exceed \$6,000,000 revenue refunding bonds (Science and Arts Academy Project), Series 2016 in connection therewith; authorizing the execution and delivery of a second amendment to bond and loan agreement and related matters. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Grider, Foy, Szymczak, Piznarski, Pacella and Alderman Looney.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Pyle to approve **ORDINANCE #12-5-16** approving the re-subdivision and variations for the property located at 7951 South Nashville Avenue. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Szymczak, Looney, Pacella, Foy, Pyle, Grider, And Alderman Piznarski.
