



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
FEBRUARY 22, 2017

CALL TO ORDER The meeting of February 22, 2017 was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79th street, Burbank, Illinois.

ROLL CALL Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Contreras, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach and Attorney Vince Cainkar.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance.

JOURNAL Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Contreras to approve the minutes of February 8, 2017 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

CURRENT BILLS Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays, Voting Aye: Alderman Foy, Pacella, Grider, Szymczak, Piznarski, Pyle and Contreras. The Chair declared the motion carried.

CLERK'S REPORT Clerk Roach reported that there was a bid opening held on February 17, 2017 on MFT Maintenance Material Bituminous Asphalt (500 Tons) and the vendors and their bid are listed below:

DEPT. OF ZONING Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve Ordinance 5-2-17 authorizing a variation to allow the operation of a child day care services facility on the property located At 8510 S. DEPT. OF PUBLIC SAFETY Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Piznarski to approve Ordinance No. 6-2-17 amending Chapter 8, Licenses and Permits, by adding Division 8, Second-hand Electronic Device Dealers, of the Municipal Code of the City of Burbank. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye; Alderman .Contreras, Pacella, Grider, Szymczak, Piznarski. Pyle and Foy.

BUSINESS**

Alderman Szymczak made the motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to award the low bidder for the 2017 MFT Maintenance Material-Bituminous to Crowley-Sheppard Asphalt Inc. with a bid proposal of \$27,794.40. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Contreras, Pyle, Foy, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella. The Chair declared the motion carried.

Mayor Klein said bituminous asphalt is made from soft coal, and asked if the students out there can tell me the other one? The audience stated it was anthracite, the hard coal.

**CITIZENS
REPORT**

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 Lavergne who wanted to know if the Blight officer can enter their yard. The Mayor said if there is blight they can and Mr. Bandusky said the neighbors behind them are afraid of the viscous dogs. He complained about the blight officer and was told to talk to the township Animal Control and Chief Shore said he would investigate further.

The Chair recognized John Przytula of 8500 S. Oak Park who wanted to know if they could take the trees and bushes from the Reservoir and was told that would be up to the Metropolitan Water Reclamation district and he suggests you call them. He then asked if there was an epidemic of break ins and he was told that people have to be careful and that the break in he was referring to was when the senior left his back door open and there is a new scam where they call people and ask "If they can hear them and they just record the "YES"

Mayor Klein said with this unusual weather there would be more break ins as when the weather is cold people don't go out. Mr. Przytula also wanted to know about Ordinance 6-2-17 and was told that it was for the protection of the residents that these stores would not buy stolen appliances and would have to keep records.

The Chair recognized Brent Kamykowski of 5702 W. 84TH St. who wanted to know if people can turn their backyards into a junk yard. The Mayor told them to call Public Works and they would assess the situation.
