**CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of April 12, 2017 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street in Burbank, Illinois.

**ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach and Attorney Vince Cainkar. Absent: Alderman Contreras.

**JOURNAL** Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Foy to approve the minutes of March 22, 2017 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair

**CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Pyle, Foy, Szymczak, Grider and Pacella.

**CLERK'S REPORT** Clerk Roach reported that City Hall will be closed Friday, April 14, in honor of the Easter holiday. Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to approve the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Burbank and the Burbank Chapter of the Combined Counties Police Association for the period January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2019. A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Szymczak, Foy, Piznarski, Grider and Pacella.

Alderman Foy made a motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak for the reappointment of Larry Fischer as Chairman of the Fire/Police Commission for a three year term beginning April 30, 2017 and ending April 30, 2020. A roll call vote indicated six ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye; Alderman Szymczak, Pyle, Foy, Piznarski, Grider and Pacella.

Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to reappoint Tom Phillips as Commissioner of the Zoning Planning and Development Commission for a three year term, beginning April 29 2017 and ending April 30, 2020. A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays, Voting Aye: Alderman Pacella, Szymczak, Foy, Piznarski Grider and Pyle.

Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to reappoint Michael Looney as Commissioner of the Zoning, Planning and Development Commission for a three year term, beginning April 29, 2017 and ending April 30, 2020. A roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderman Grider, Pacella, Foy, Szymczak, Piznarski and Pyle.

Alderman Szymczak made the motion seconded by Alderman Foy under Public Works for the 85<sup>th</sup> Street Rehabilitation – Harlem Avenue to Cicero Avenue Project No. 16369 bid opening held April 5, 2017 to award the bid to the lowest bidder which is Triggs Construction for the low bid of \$3,020,568.15. A Roll call vote indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderman Foy, Pacella, Grider, Szymczak, Piznarski and Pyle.

Mayor Klein said we would have liked to have done 85<sup>th</sup> Street when we did 83<sup>rd</sup> street but we did not have the money at the time. We do have the money now and it will be a beautiful project for the paving of those streets.

**CITIZEN'S  
REPORT**

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 S. Lavergne who said months ago he asked why doesn't Burbank have an entrance tax as they have an exit tax. He was very upset with his next door neighbors and felt that he was give lip service and no action, Chief Shore said there are people living in the house as it is rental property. Mayor Klein said he would check with the water department and the Garbage company to see if they are paying their bills.

The Chair recognized Mary Ann Pajak of 5516 W, 83<sup>RD</sup> Pl. who said she has a serious rat problem and he said we work with Stickney Township and we will check with them to see if everything possible is being done. She said she has taken lots of pictures and they are very large and are also by her rental property.

The Chair recognized Frank Przytula of 8503 S. Oak Park who asked if there would be notices sent out when they would be doing the paving on 85<sup>th</sup> street from Cicero to Harlem. Tim Geary said there would be.
