



REGULAR MEETING

BURBANK CITY COUNCIL  
JULY 19, 2017

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of July 19, 2017 was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Dan M. Foy in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79<sup>th</sup> Street Burbank, Illinois.
- ROLL CALL** Mayor Foy requested a roll call which indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski, Alderman Pyle, Mayor Foy, Clerk Szymczak and Treasurer Dean Viverito.
- JOURNAL** Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to approve the minutes of June 28, 2017. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gustafson to approve the current list of bills. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- CLERK'S REPORT** Clerk Szymczak reported that we are still on summer meeting schedule and the next Council Meeting is Wednesday August 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:30 PM
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Robert Contreras made a motion in reference to Ordinance #10-7-17 approving the Clare Subdivision for the property located at 7706 South Natoma Avenue, Burbank, Il. The motion was seconded by Alderman Pyle. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- DEPT. OF ADMINISTRATION** Mayor Foy asked for a motion to approve Ordinance #11-7-17 amending the Municipal Code of the City of Burbank by adding Chapter 2, Administration, Article XX, Public Safety Employee Benefits. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderwoman Gagle. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Alderman Robert Contreras made a motion to have the City Attorney prepare an ordinance for Petition #17-06-1, Andrew and Sebastian Zaborski of 5556 West 83<sup>rd</sup> Street, Burbank, Il., for a variation to install a 6' privacy fence on front yard side setback. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Gustafson. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

Alderman Contreras then made a motion to have the City Attorney prepare an ordinance for Petition 17-06-2, Henry Sakowski, 5402 West 84<sup>th</sup> Street, Burbank, Il., for a variation to install a 6' privacy fence on front yard side set back. The motion was seconded by Alderman Pacella. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

Alderwoman Gagle made a presentation of 2 Departmental Commendations to Det. Jonathan Malacina and Sgt. Israel Rodriguez. On January 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>, 2017, Det. Malacina, being part of the South Suburban Major Crimes Task Force, assisted the Evergreen Park Police Dept. in the investigation of a homicide in that town and through his efforts eventually led to the apprehension of the suspect at a Metra Station in Deerfield, Illinois. Shots were fired by the suspect, but none by Police due to the presence of civilians. On November 1, 2016, Sgt. Rodriguez was part of the investigation of a missing suicidal person from Burbank, Il. Eventually, the person was located in her vehicle which was partially submerged in Tampier Lake in unincorporated Cook County. He attempted a rescue, but was unable to reach the vehicle until assistance from the local municipalities arrived. The victim survived.

Division Chief Michael Dudlo informed the gallery that there was a recent theft of services at a business in the area of 79<sup>th</sup> & Latrobe. Both suspects were apprehended in a timely manner and because of further investigations, it was determined that the suspects were wanted by other Departments in the Northern Suburbs for additional thefts.

Fire Chief David Gilgenberg III, along with Lt. Barker and FF/PM Huedepohl, demonstrated the use of a Stair Chair which is used for the easy removal of victims from lower and upper levels of homes and businesses. The costs of these 2 chairs were \$7000.00 each. The City of Burbank purchased 1 chair funds from the Burbank Firemen's Club were used for the seconded. Also on display were thermo-imaging cameras which are used for detecting victims in smoke-filled or darkened

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 South Lavergne. Mr. Bandusky inquired about the possible installation of "Yield" signs in the area of 87<sup>th</sup> & Lamon for excessive traffic problems. The Mayor asked Chief Shore to give special attention to the area. Mr. Bandusky then asked for clarification of a Zoning Board public notice and the meaning of "Clare Subdivision" in a previous ordinance approval.

The Chair then recognized Frank Pryztula of 8503 South Oak Park Ave. who supplied the Council with a list of damages which occurred at the Louis Viverito Senior Center recently.

The Chair then recognized Joyce Lenzy of 8139 South Sayre Ave who had concerns of a grass easement at 8145 South Sayre. The Mayor requested Public Works Director Bill Trovato and Blight Officer Dave Wilson to investigate the situation. Mayor Foy informed Ms. Lenzy that he would also drive by and survey the property. He also informed the audience that, through a combined effort of the City of Burbank, the Village of Bridgeview and the South Stickney Sanitary District, the field located at 83<sup>rd</sup> & Nottingham has been cleaned. Commonwealth Edison is responsible for the mowing of the lawn in that field.

The Chair then recognized Jerry Synoga of 8109 South Normandy who needed clarification of the new agreement between the City and Eligo Energy. Mayor Foy explained the basics of the agreement.

There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Grider and seconded by Alderman Piznarski with unanimous voice approval and so declared by the Chair.
