



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
SEPTEMBER 13, 2017

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of September 13, 2017 was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Dan M. Foy in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79th Street Burbank, Illinois.
- ROLL CALL** Mayor Foy requested a roll call which indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski, Alderman Pyle, Mayor Foy and Clerk Szymczak. Absent: Treasurer Viverito
- JOURNAL** Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gagle to approve the minutes of August 23, 2017. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to approve the current list of bills. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Robert Contreras made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gagle to approve Ordinance # 20-9-17 authorizing a variation to allow the construction of a six-foot front/side yard fence for the property located at 7701 South Mobile Ave., Burbank, Il. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- Alderman Robert Contreras made a motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to approve Ordinance # 21-9-17 authorizing a variation to allow the construction of a six-foot front/ yard fence for the property located at 7000 W. 82nd St. Burbank, Il. A roll call vote indicated & Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- DEPT. OF PUBLIC WORKS** Alderman Piznarski made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to allow the City of Burbank to purchase 2-2017 Ford F 450 dump trucks and 1-2017 Ford F 150 pick-up truck through Westfield Ford of Countryside, Il for the Dept. of Public Works for an amount not to exceed \$112, 000.00. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

Mayor Foy asked for a motion to revise Resolution #6-2-17 relating to participation in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund for the City of Burbank. The motion was made by Alderman Grider and seconded by Alderman Pyle. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

Mayor Foy asked for a motion to adopt Resolution 9-1-17 commemorating Moraine Valley Community College on their 50th Anniversary. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pyle. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle. John Coleman represented Moraine Valley Community College to accept the framed Resolution which was read by Mayor Foy.

Mayor Foy informed the Council and audience that a proclamation has been issued by the City of Burbank making September “National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month.”

Mayor Foy then informed the Council and audience that the City of Burbank was awarded a grant for \$100,000.00 from the Cook County Bureau of Economic Development (CDBG Program 2017) for street improvement.

Mayor Foy also informed the audience that Stickney Public Health District is offering free influenza inoculations to all First Responders.

**CITIZEN'S
REPORT**

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 South Leclaire who inquired of the City of Burbank was solvent. Mayor Foy explained that the City's finances are in excellent shape and that we are running under budget. Mr. Bandusky then inquired about the City of Burbank becoming a “sanctuary city”. The Chair informed Mr. Bandusky that no such plans are being discussed.

The Chair then recognized Frank Pryztula of 8503 South Oak Park Ave. who wanted to personally thank Frank Kainrath and Alderman Jason Pyle on advice they had given him on a situation.

The Chair then recognized City Engineer Tim Geary who informed the audience that the 85th Street re-paving project is in its final phase and should be completed within 2-3 weeks.

Mayor Foy then invited any Reavis High School students to have their government class forms signed after the Council Meeting was adjourned.

There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella with unanimous voice approval and so declared by the Chair.
