**CALL TO
ORDER**

The meeting of February 28, 2018 was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Dan M. Foy in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79th Street Burbank, Illinois.

Alderwoman Barb Gagle made a motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to promote FF/PM Anthony M. Pesha to the rank of Engineer with the Burbank Fire Department. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. FF/PM Pesha was sworn in by Claude Haerr of the Fire / Police Commission. Mayor Foy read a brief biography of the candidate.

Alderwoman Barb Gagle informed the Council and audience that the City is reviewing the possibility of initiating a Code Enforcement Program which would include the hiring of 2 part time employees. She will keep everyone informed of the review procedure.

The Chair recognized Frank Pryztula 8503 S. Oak Park Ave. who had a question about police response in the event of a school shooting. Chief Richard Shore was in attendance and explained the procedures that have always been set in place for such an incident.

The Chair then recognized Sharon Lake 7620 S. Michigan Ave. who wanted to inform the City of the ongoing labor relations situation between workers and the management of Veracare at 5400 West 79th St. The Mayor responded by stating that the problem had nothing to do with the daily business of the City but would meet with them at the adjournment of the meeting so that they could voice their concerns.

Mayor Foy then directed any students from Reavis H.S. to have their government class forms signed at the adjournment of the meeting.

There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderwoman Gagle with unanimous voice approval and so declared by the Chair.
