**CALL TO  
ORDER**

The meeting of March 14, 2018 was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Dan M. Foy in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79<sup>th</sup> Street Burbank, Illinois.

**ROLL CALL**

Mayor Foy requested a roll call which indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski, Alderman Pyle, Mayor Foy, Clerk Szymczak, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Vince Cainkar.

**JOURNAL**

Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gagle to approve the minutes of February 28, 2018. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

**CURRENT  
BILLS**

Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to approve the current list of bills. A roll call indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderwoman Gustafson, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

**PUBLIC  
HEARING**

Mayor Foy asked City Attorney Vince Cainkar to conduct a public hearing relative to the Appropriation Ordinance for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2018 and ending December 31, 2018. Mr. Cainkar stated that pursuant to state law, a public notice was published in the local paper informing the public of said hearing. Mr. Cainkar stated that in 2017, the City's revenues exceeded expenditures which, in one case, allowed for additional funds to be placed in the pension fund for the Police and Fire departments and the prospects for 2018 look good as well. An ordinance to adopt the 2018 City Appropriations would be prepared and ready for passage at the March 28<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting. At the conclusion, Mayor Foy asked if there were any questions concerning the hearing. He then stated to have the record reflect that the public hearing was held and adjourned pursuant to law. A copy of the latest version of the proposed appropriation ordinance or formally prepared appropriation document is available for public inspection in the Office of the City Treasurer.

**CITIZEN'S  
REPORT**

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky 8548 South LaVergne who inquired about the progress of Dee Dee's Bargains and the Dunkin Donuts projects. Mayor Foy gave the audience a progress report on both locations.

The Chair then asked Police Chief Richard Shore to give a brief summary of an armed robbery which occurred at Dollar General at 86<sup>th</sup> & Cicero earlier in the day. Chief Shore gave the audience basic information on the situation but stated that the offenders were captured in Chicago.

Mayor Foy stated that Chief Shore and Alderman Contreras would be conducting a seminar at the Louis Vivierito Senior Center in the near future regarding deceptive practices.

**CITIZEN'S  
REPORT  
(CONT'D.)**

The Chair then recognized Building Commissioner Dave Ricchiuto who also asked that the citizens be aware of possible deceptive practices in home improvement solicitors, especially when it came to estimates.

Mayor Foy then directed any students from Reavis H.S. to have their government class forms signed at the adjournment of the meeting.

There being no further business, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella with unanimous voice approval and so declared by the Chair.
