



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
APRIL 25, 2012

CALL TO ORDER The meeting of April 25, 2012 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79th Street, Burbank, IL.

ROLL CALL Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Szymczak, Grider, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Clerk Roach, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Vince Cainkar. Absent: Alderman Looney and Alderman Pacella.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

JOURNAL Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Foy to approve the minutes of April 11, 2012 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

CURRENT BILLS Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 5 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Grider, Foy, Szymczak, Piznarski and Pyle.

The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Szymczak, Foy, Piznarski and Grider.	
	Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Szkymczak to reappoint Jay Bartusiak as Commissioner/Secretary, Fire and Police Commission , for a three year term beginning April 30, 2012 and expiring April 29, 2015. A roll call vote indicated 5 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Pyle, Grider, Foy and Szymczak.

Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to authorize the attorney to prepare an ordinance for #12-03-2 **Burbank Park District 8440 State Road, Burbank, Illinois 60459 requesting a parking variation and to allow off site parking.** This was approved by Zoning. A roll call vote indicated 5 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Szymczak, Foy, Pyle, Grider and Piznarski.

**CITIZEN'S
REPORT**

The Chair recognized the first citizen who said she lived right around 86th and Natchez and that yesterday there was gunfire around her house and she was upset that the schools were not notified and it was around 1:00 p.m. Mayor Klein told her he was very aware of this incident as soon as it happened he was in touch with the police department. He also said that the police department were on top of this and he did not want to discuss it in public at this time as they don't want this investigation compromised. He said the Police Chief would talk to them after the meeting is over.

The Chair then recognized another citizen who said she lives around 83rd Place and Narragansett who said that about two weeks ago at 11:30 in the morning there was seven rounds of gunfire around her home. She then related an incident from two years ago on the 4th of July where a young boy was running from a gang and she took him into her home, but couldn't help but worry since they know where her house is. Mayor Klein told her never to hesitate to call the police. He said we all too often act like ostriches and bury our heads in the sand. He told her we know who these people are and we will be acting to rid the city of these gangs.

The next citizen the Chair recognized said he lived on the block of 83rd and Narragansett and his house was shot at seven times. He said in the last two months there have been much violence in the neighborhood and he is very afraid, and wants to know what the police are doing about this. The Mayor said he would be afraid too. He repeated that the City is not reacting but acting to the situation at hand. He said we have a plan and we will be doing things that will benefit the people of this city. He said we know who the vermin are and we will do what we can "under law". He then said this situation is universal and a lot of this is resting upon the heels of the parents who have no control and let them do whatever they want even if they are wearing gang colors. they are blind to their own situation.

Mayor Klein then said if you see anything suspicious call 911 and the police will be there. He then said he raised three children and he said they never conned him to the extent that they would be out riding in a car shooting at people. He said be the caretakers for your children. If you see anything suspicious he said in this case a car was seen riding around three times. He said in a case like that you call 911 and the police can get assistance from their own cars.

The Chair recognized the next citizen who said she lived around 85th and Meade and was concerned about drug paraphernalia and had called the police several times when she saw something suspicious. She then mentioned the Family Dollar Store on 87th street which got robbed and about a month ago and she called the police to see what was going on and was told not to worry about it and they acted like they knew nothing. Mayor Klein told her that he was sure the Police Chief would validate that when you call 911 the calls are dispatched to us and no one should talk to you like that. Any time you see anything suspicious don't give up and call **911** and it won't be tolerated for a response to a citizen not to worry about it.

Mayor Klein then said he appreciated input from the citizens. He said it was just in the news that kids are drinking liquid hand sanitizer which contains 85% alcohol. Tinley Park just passed an ordinance for some of these synthetic drugs that used to be sold at some of the 7-11 stores. not to be sold. We passed that ordinance six months ago for that to be illegal in Burbank.

Mayor Klein then invited the Reavis students to come up after the meeting is adjourned and that anyone at the front table or at the Council table could sign their government class papers.

There being no further business to be brought before the City Council, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to adjourn was agreed upon by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
