



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
JUNE 13, 2012

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of June 13, 2012 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79th Street, Burbank, IL.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski. and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Clerk Roach, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Vince Cankar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider, seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of May 23, 2012 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Looney, Pacella, Pyle, Szymczak, Foy, Piznarski and Grider
- DEPT. OF ADMINISTRATION** Mayor Klein said he wanted to make a comment on a family that had two children nine and ten years old missing in Burbank and had called the Burbank police. Our police had an alert out to all residents and also notified the various police agencies in the area and by 5:00 p.m. they were returned to their home, one was in pajamas walking the street. He commended the police department for such a good job done and he said it just seems appropriate when we are honoring four new police officers that are being hired today that we can relate this story. The audience applauded.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Looney to approve **Ordinance No. 12-6-12 authorizing a variation to allow the construction of a six-foot front /side yard fence for the property located at 7556 S. Latrobe.** A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Pacella, Looney, Pyle, Grider, Foy and Szymczak.
- DEPT. OF PUBLIC SAFETY** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to hire the following police officers: **Michael Wasilewski, Brian Radowicz, Kevin Lombard and Guy Ott.** A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Piznarski, Foy, Grider, Looney, Szymczak and Pacella. Mayor Klein then asked the candidates to come forward and then he announced that Larry Fischer, Chairman of the Police and Fire Commission will be swearing them in. After Chairman Fischer swore them in to the rank of Patrolman, the audience clapped and then Mayor Klein read a short bio on each of the officers:

He has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Law Enforcement and Justice Administration from Western Illinois University and is currently serving an internship with the Burbank Police department.

Kevin Lombard is 24 years old, single, with no children. Kevin has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Law Enforcement and Justice Administration from Western Illinois University and is a graduate of Brother Rice High School. Kevin comes from a Law Enforcement family. His father currently serves as a Sergeant in the homicide division of the Chicago Police department.

Guy has worked with the Burbank Police department for the past 5 years as a civilian employee and booking officer.
