**CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of October 24, 2012 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street, Burbank, IL.

Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to authorize the attorney to prepare an ordinance for Item 12-08-2 City of Burbank 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street, Burbank, Il. 60459 – The Petitioner is asking for an amendment of the Ordinance Text Amendments to the Burbank Zoning Code will be considered which will affect all zoning districts in the City of Burbank. The amendments will add provisions to prohibiting Electric-generating wind devices and the erection of any accessory structure on a lot prior to the establishment or construction of a Principal structure or building. Provisions will also be added to regulate the construction and location of photovoltaic systems. **Approved by Zoning.** A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Piznarski, Foy, Grider, Looney, Szymczak and Pacella. Mayor Klein said this will be brought up at the next City Council meeting.

Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak for the 2013 MFT Maintenance Material – 3,000 tons Bulk Rock Salt \$180,000.00 Bid opening held October 11, 2012 Resolution No. 8-1-12 to award to the lowest bidder which is North American Salt. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Szymczak, Looney, Pacella, Foy, Pyle, Grider and Pyle.

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 S. Lavergne who asked what is the population of Burbank and what is its budget. The Mayor told him the population is 28, 945 and its budget is a little over 17 million dollars. Mr. Bandusky said he does not mean to be a thorn in his side by attending these meetings and Mayor Klein told him he is very welcome and he shares his concern that the residents do not attend these meeting and he publishes in his newsletters when the council and committee meetings are. Mr. Bandusky says he knows that Reavis has a high budget and their meetings aren't well attended. The Mayor commented when there is a gang issue or a special swearing in of police officers or firemen we have a crowd, but usually we don't. All citizens are welcome to attend and he would like to send them a letter personally, but that would be too expensive.
