



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
FEBRUARY 8, 2012

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of February 8 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79th Street, Burbank, IL.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Clerk Roach, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Vince Cainkar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of January 25, 2012 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Foy, Szymczak, Grider, Looney, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle.
- CLERK'S REPORT** Clerk Roach said she would like everyone to know that City Hall will be closed Monday, February 20, 2012 in commemoration of President's day.
- PUBLIC HEARING ON THE 2012 CDBGP** Mayor Klein turned the meeting over to Attorney Vince Cainkar to conduct the Public Hearing on the 2012 Cook County Development Block Grant Program. Attorney Vince Cainkar said that this will be the second Public Hearing on the 2012 CDBGP application. He said the application has been prepared and there is a resolution on the agenda. The application is for a grant in the amount of \$130,000.00. The total project cost is \$292,652.00, which means the matching part of the City is \$162,652.00. The project is the proposed reconstruction of the 7500-7600 blocks of Latrobe avenue, i.e. Latrobe Avenue from 75th street all the way to State Road. He then asked if there were any questions or comments on the application. He then said once the resolution is passed tonight the application will be made to the County. Mayor Klein said let the record reflect that the hearing was held according to law.
- Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to approve **Resolution No. 2-1-12 approving the Community Development Block Grant application.** A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Looney, Pacella, Pyle, Szymczak, Foy, Piznarski and Grider.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to approve **Ordinance No. 3-2-12 approving a rezoning from R-2 Limited Multi-family Residence District to R-3 Multi-family Residence District and a variation to Section 5-6(B)(3), Lot width, to allow the use and occupancy of a three dwelling unit apartment building located at 5217 West 79th street.**

A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Piznarski, Foy, Grider, Looney, Szymczak and Pacella.
