



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
JANUARY 11, 2012

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of January 11, 2012 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79th Street, Burbank, IL.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Clerk Roach, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Vince Cainkar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider and seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of December 21, 2011 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Pacella, Looney, Pyle, Grider, Foy and Szymczak.
- DEPT. OF PUBLIC SAFETY** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Piznarski to approve **Ordinance No. 1-1-12 amending Chapter 15, Traffic, Article X, Administrative Adjudication of Vehicle Regulation Violations, Section 15-158, Scheduling of Fines/Penalties, of the Municipal Code of the City of Burbank.** A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pacella, Grider, Piznarski, Looney, Pyle, Szymczak and Foy.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to Approve **Ordinance No. 2-1-12 amending Section 5-3(B) (10), Garage and Section 5-4(B) (11), Garage, of the City of Burbank Zoning Code.** A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Foy, Szymczak, Grider, Looney, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle.
- CITIZEN'S REPORT** The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 Lavergne who wanted to know what these ordinances mean. Mayor Klein told him in the first ordinance they are changing fines for various violations of traffic, one of which is when you park in a handicapped parking spot. He then wanted to know about the Garage ordinance and Frank Kainrath offered to explain it to him after the meeting which he agreed to. Mr. Bandusky then wanted to know the status of the house next door to him at 8554 S. Lavergne since they have not been in there for six weeks and he saw their garbage being tagged. Mayor Klein said this sounded like the house was in foreclosure and Mr. Kainrath agreed that it was in foreclosure.
- The Chair then recognized Mary Valloni who lives at 7711 S. Rutherford and she said they have an issue with a commercial vehicle parked in their driveway for three years. She recently got a ticket for parking it there and was told by the police to contact their alderman which she said she tried to do was not able to get a hold of him.

She then quoted Section 15-5 Parking and Driving in Certain Zoned Areas. It basically states that you are allowed to park one van designed for passenger use not to exceed 20 ft. in length or one standardized vehicle which weighs less than 8,000 pounds. She then said they have one commercial vehicle in their driveway which has been ticketed. She said they paid it at the police department. She said the van has no writing on it. Mayor Klein said you do acknowledge that it is a commercial vehicle. Tim Valloni was then recognized by Mayor Klein as he wanted to talk also and they both wanted to know the next step they should proceed to. Chief Radowicz said he would look into this matter. Mayor Klein then asked Mr. Valloni what the vehicle was used for. Mr. Valloni replied that he was an electrician and it was used for work and he was told that he couldn't have it on his property at all.

Alderman Foy asked if it was a panel van and Mr. Valloni replied that it was. Mr. Valloni said he wasn't the owner of the van as it was owned by his company and when asked if it was licensed here he replied that he knew it was in Alsip. Mayor Klein told him it should have tags here and Mr. Valloni said that wasn't the issue and Mayor Klein told him it was now. He said the ticket was for having the vehicle parked in his driveway.

Alderman Foy asked if they park it on the street and they said they were told they couldn't do that. Alderman Foy said there is a resident who is going around checking to see if residents have a commercial vehicle parked in their driveway and he is calling the police and alerting them of the addresses. The reason he is doing that is he got a ticket for having a big box truck parked in front of his neighbor's house and it is over 20 ft.. It would make more sense that someone is calling the police since it has been in your driveway for over 3 years without anyone bothering you. Mayor Klein told the Valloni's to talk to the police chief after the meeting. They thanked the Mayor for listening to them.
