- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of October 23, 2013 was called to order by Mayor Harry J.Klein at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chamber, 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street Burbank, Illinois
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach and Attorney Vince Cainkar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of October 9, 2013 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Szymczak, Looney, Pacella, Foy, Pyle, Grider and Piznarski.

OF ZONING** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to approve Ordinance No, 40-10-13 amending Chapter 9, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provision, by adding Section 9-87, Clothing Drop Boxes Prohibited, to the Burbank Municipal Code of the City of Burbank. Lt. Gilgenberg has been a “life-long” resident of Burbank and has been with the department since 1991 and as a fulltime firefighter since 1994. Dave has earned his Masters Degree in Fire Service and Homeland Security Management from Southern Illinois University. During his time with the Burbank Fire dept. Dave has served in a number of Capacities:

Technical Rescue Specialist, serving on the Division #21 Tehnical Rescue Team

Selected to the Illinois USAR (urban search and rescue) team – Illinois Taskforce #1

Implemented the Burbank Fire Department’s Fire Cadet Program

Oversees the development of the Fire department’s Firehouse Software program

Developed and directed the Fire department’s public fire education Program

A hazard materials specialist, fire investigator, and certified Fire Officer Level II.

Dave is married to his wife Liz and they reside in Burbank with their two children.

The Mayor then asked Dave to come forward and gave him his new badge and everyone applauded.
