



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
SEPTEMBER 25, 2013

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of September 25, 2013 was called to order by Mayor Harry J. Klein at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chamber, 6530 W. 79th Street Burbank, Illinois
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach and Attorney Vince Cainkar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of September 11, 2013 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Foy, Szymczak, Grider, Looney, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle.
- DEPT. OF ADMINISTRATION** Mayor Klein asked the indulgence of the City Council in passing Ordinance No. 37-9-13 amending section 3-5, Limitation on number of licenses issued Chapter 3, Alcoholic Beverages, of the Burbank Municipal Code pertaining to liquor licenses. Alderman Pacella made the motion seconded by Alderman Pyle to pass Ordinance No. 37-9-13 as outlined above. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Grider, Foy, Szymczak, Piznarski, Pyle, Pacella and Looney.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to authorize the attorney to prepare an ordinance for Item 13-08-1 Michael Van Klev 5768 W. 77th Street, Burbank, Il. Petitioner is requesting a variation to operate an electrical construction business in an R-1 district. Approved by Zoning. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Szymczak, Looney, Pacella, Foy, Pyle, Grider and Piznarski.
- Alderman Foy made the motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to authorize the attorney to prepare an ordinance for Item 13-08-2 Josephine Jackson, 5501 84th Street, Burbank, Il. Petitioner is requesting a variation to install a 6' privacy fence on side front yard. Approved by Zoning. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pacella, Grider, Piznarski, Looney, Pyle, Szymczak and Foy.
- CITIZEN'S REPORT** The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 S. Lavergne who asked Mayor Klein if he ever rides around Burbank and the Mayor replied every day. He then asked about a few houses the first being 4939 W. 84th St., He said it has been boarded up for a year, 82nd and Lamont he said he doesn't know what is going on at that house besides

plumbing problems. Last he wanted to know what was going on with Ray Tieri's old house at 83rd and Long. Mr. Bandusky said he heard that it was owned by a veteran in Iraq. Mayor Klein asked Frank Kainrath, the Building Inspector, if he knew the status on this house. Mr. Kainrath said it is scheduled for demolition.

The Chair then recognized Mr. Glenn Kadas 7809 S. Austin. Mr. Kadas said he has lived here for 38 years and a couple of weeks ago Residents only signs were put up and no residents were advised this was being done. He said there is a group who resides at 6000 W. 79th street and whenever they have meetings they block our driveways and the police do give tickets but they also think that this building is being occupied by more people than the building has capacity for judging by the number of cars. He said with having a lot of children on their block, there is a safety concern.

Mayor Klein then asked Fire Chief Harper to check the occupancy of that building because we can do something about that and Chief Harper said he would. Secondly in respect to residential parking the Mayor said we have residential parking in a number of areas in Burbank and there are solutions to these problems when you have a large party like getting placards for your visitors. Mr. Kadas said he went to the police department and was told they have nothing to do with parking. The Mayor asked the Police Chief if they no longer give placards and he said not for that area but if they get tickets, they can just drop them off at the police department. The Mayor said on his block they have signs saying "resident parking only between 10 a.m. and 3:00 p.m." which is to stop the Reavis students from parking there. Mr. Kadas said it doesn't specify resident for that block. Chief Radowicz said they must live in that zone and the police officer can check that out and if they live on 87th street, they are going to get a ticket.

Mayor Klein then recognized Robert Negrette of 7808 Austin who said the signs were not put up for the Reavis students but for this religious group who are located at 6000 W. 79th street. Clerk Roach asked him if there was a problem during the day because that is where the day care Rocking Robin is and he said the problems are at night, or on the weekends. Mayor Klein said how about if we give each resident on the block 3 passes. Mr. James Browne of 7828 S. Austin spoke up and said he didn't understand why they had to go through all this. He said this problem has been going on for years and it is all because of this group who have been very rude to them, double parking and this has all been going on since "September 11th" He said the police have been giving out plenty of tickets when they could be doing other things. He said they have blocked their driveways and in alleys at 1:00 in the morning and their answer is where are we supposed to park. Mayor Klein said he will talk to the police chief and will come up with an answer. He said he was aware that one night there was a memorial there for someone who had died and there were parking problems but if it is occurring all the time there is a problem.

Mr. Kopezal of 7848 Austin said he just had someone spray paint his vinyl garage and he did call the police department and they referred him to Public Works. He said it seems like it happens in basketball and football season. Mayor Klein extended his sympathy to him.

Mayor Klein then recognized Giovania Depasqualle of 7834 S. Austin who complained about people jumping over their fences and wonders what else they could be doing. Mayor Klein said he will see that the police department will put more patrols in that area.
