



REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE  
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL  
JANUARY 27, 2010

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of January 27, 2010 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street, Burbank, IL.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Pollard, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach, and Attorney Vince Cainkar
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag..
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Pollard to approve the minutes of January 13, 2010 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair..
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pyle, Piznarski, Foy, Grider, Pollard, Szymczak and Pacella.
- PUBLIC HEARING 2010 ON THE CDBGP GRANT** Mayor Klein said there was one item on the agenda for discussion and that was the 2010 Cook County Community Development Block Grant Program. He then asked Attorney Cainkar to conduct this meeting. Attorney Cainkar called the Public Hearing to order at 7:32 p.m. He explained that the Public Hearing is for the 2010 Cook County Community Development Block Grant Program. Cook County is expected to receive \$10,500,000 which is a little more than last year. Like last year the activities funded by the **CDBG** must meet the needs of the low/moderate income residents with the primary objective of developing viable urban communities and a secondary objective of eliminating slums and blight. Applications can be made to Cook County for one or more projects in the following categories: (1) Housing, Residential Rehabilitation and Housing Related Activities; (2) Economic Development Activities (3) Commercial Rehabilitation, (4) Capital Improvements: Public Facilities and Improvements; (5) Real Property Acquisition, (6) Clearance Activities, (7) Planning Activities and (8) Public Service Activities.
- In the past the City of Burbank has made application for and received grants for Capital Improvements. The county regulations provide that for capital improvements the census block groups must contain at least 49.0% low/moderate income and they use the 2000 census data to determine this. There are actually seven block groups in the City of Burbank which meet those criteria and they have met those criteria for the last eight years. He then said that most of them are on the north side of 79<sup>th</sup> street. He then said at this time the purpose of the public hearing is to receive input from the public and the City officials, Attorney Cainkar then asked the Mayor if the council or the engineer had suggestions. He then explained that in order to put an application together we have to have another public hearing and have everything submitted by the February 18<sup>th</sup> deadline.

Mayor Klein asked if anyone from the City Council had any suggestions for the use of funds. Alderman Pollard asked what was the status on the project for 78<sup>th</sup> and 79<sup>th</sup> Massasoit. Attorney Cainkar told Alderman Pollard that was a 2009 project and would be finished in 2010. Mayor Klein then asked the audience if they had any suggestions. The audience had none but the engineer Tim Geary from Novotony said they were considering the area from 76<sup>th</sup> Pl. to 76<sup>th</sup> St. on Lorel and the area from Lorel to Long and 77<sup>th</sup> Place. Attorney Cainkar told Bill Trovato and Tim Geary they needed an engineer's estimate as soon as possible. Mayor Klein said we should have this estimate like yesterday so the 18<sup>th</sup> of February deadline can be met. Mayor Klein said since there are no other suggestions let the record reflect that the meeting was held pursuant to law and it is now closed.
